PRIME HOGGS - 1920



Another good entry of hoggs met an excellent trade for lights and mediums but heavies a much more selective trade. Best export 237.5p, 236.6p 235.7p etc. Top price £100 for 46kg. Heavies £85 - £90, average 189.8p/kg. Every hogg averaged £86.88. Far too many heavy hoggs about for the trade to cope with at good money so the trade on them falls. Weather has kept hoggs growing well and putting on weight so big hoggs are the result. 2000 can be sold every week without affecting trade.

REARING/WEANED CALVES - 56

The larger entry commenced with 28 rearing calves all under 42 days, they sold well topping at £330 for a strong 30 day old Hereford x bull from Mr P Davies, who also sold a heifer at £240. The major consignment were also Hereford x calves. The heifers outsold the bulls on every occasion. Heifers selling to £215 and mostly from £105 to £210, bulls from £60 to £120. British Blue x bulls sold well at £265. 3 nice heifers from £230 to £240. Named sire Angus x bulls at £160. 28 weaned calves sold to £605 for stronger Angus x heifers with a similar British Blue x at £530. The bunch of Blue x steers at £500. The draft of 6 well reared British Blue x heifers, 4 months caught the eye selling at £405 and £400. Blue x bulls of similar age at £395 with an Angus x bull at £370. Angus x heifers at £350. Hereford x at £240. Smaller but older sorts ranged from £220 to £385. These numbers can be sold each week, we need weekly consignors of rearing calves under 42 days.

The annual 'Ball of Madley' show and sale of couples attracted a tremendous entry of numbers and quality with virtually a total clearance to a large crowd of purchasers and onlookers. Top price was £235 for a pen of 10 Texel x yearlings with 20 lambs at foot exhibited by Mr J B C Gwillim who was awarded the championship for his pen of 10 Texel x yearlings with their singles, they sold at £200. A very smart pen of Welsh Mule yearlings with twins from annual consignor Mrs B M Horne were first prize in their section and sold at £225. Ewes with youth, good body condition or with strong lambs were keenly sought throughout the sale with 14 lots over £200 and a further 51 lots from £150 to £198 reflecting the **quality on offer.**

Other older lowland ewes from £80 to £148. Another large entry of hill type ewes sold to an improved trade with most singles from £65 to £105. Twins from £80 to £127. The entry included 255 hoggs with their lambs, both Texel and Suffolk x sold to great interest with all the best sorts from £172 to £200. Others from £100 to £146. Harder selling were the Mule hoggs which topped at £155 and from £120 to £142.

The show was judged by father and son Rob and James Watkins who awarded 18 prizes - full list over page.

What a day, a superb entry of cull ewes sold to an average of £69/head to include all types forward selling up to £139/head for Texel ewes from J & M C Hartwright, Springfields. Any amount of ewes £120 to £130 with Suffolks to £110/head. The small plain Welsh/Speckle ewes were still a fantastic trade and as dear as last week. The lean is definitely outselling the fat regardless of breed and size. No end of nice selling ewes trading £80 to £90 throughout the sale, however the fat ewes would look a big eyeful with the stronger fat Suffolks £80 to £88, however all ewes meeting a very competitive trade especially given the very large entry. 7 buyers from start to finish all competing fiercely throughout the sale, with ewes right at the end selling to £115/head plus. Keep the ewes coming. Despite of the huge entry all business complete before 5pm and trade remained excellent throughout.

SHEEP SCAB

We all know that sheep scab is a recurring problem throughout the country but at Hereford we have had several examples of sheep being presented for sale with advanced 'scab'. This is totally unacceptable and brings the market into disrepute as 'scab' is highly contagious and can spread from sheep to sheep with alarming speed. From now onwards any sheep in such condition will not be offered for sale and will be put back on the vendor's transport to be returned to them at their expense. The NSA guidance for the prevention and eradication of Scab is total emersion dipping. We trust that you will appreciate the stance that we must take regarding Scab as we are selling large numbers of store sheep, breeding ewes etc., to return to farms and the confidence and value of these types of livestock will be greatly reduced if infected sheep are seen on the same premises.

PLEASE HELP US TO HELP YOURSELVES

NOTICE TO VENDORS OF STORE HOGGS

We are having increased incidence of C.Ovis being reported by abattoirs when slaughtering hoggs. This condition in the carcase of hoggs is caused by worms from dogs which can lead to the carcass being 100% condemned.

Most farm dogs are correctly wormed, but please make certain that your worming programme is up to date and be aware that most incidences of C.Ovis arise from land with public access, footpaths or common land where dogs roam.

Unauthorised dog-walking on your land can cause problems - please be aware.

All ram hoggs need to be declared and sold separate to bunches of mixed hoggs. Any ram hoggs found in a bunch of mixed hoggs not declared to the auctioneers will be subject to a price reduction. We have buyers for ram hoggs so please do not put them in bunches of clean mixed hoggs. Vendors please note - any hoggs not presented correct for sale and not declared to the auctioneers will risk being deducted.

ALL HOGGS PRESENTED IN THE STORE SECTION NEED TO BE TAGGED WITH AN ELECTRONIC SLAUGHTER TAG AS MINIMUM. VENDORS ALSO NEED TO PROVE THEIR HOGGS ARE FARM ASSURED AS THIS HAS BECOME AN IMPORTANT FACTOR.
